



TAGS IN FOCUS

March's favorite tagger is Brigitte

DARK ANGEL

We couldn't wait to publish the interview with one of our most active visitors and taggers, as well as the founder of an online community 'Tagger's Voice' known under the nickname Dark Angel. What was planned as a great and fun to read interview turned out to be a breathtaking experience of talking to a woman with so many things to tell. She answered some questions for us, sharing her views, ideas and experience.

PFD: How did you arrive to working with psp-tubes? When did it happen?

DA: I started creating tags back in 2004. I had seen a few others creating some things and wanted to learn, but back then it was such a “secret” and no one wanted to share how, so I started out using Photoshop and teaching myself how to create them. I became wonderful friends with someone I consider a sister now, Debbie “WolfDreamer” Phillips and she helped me to start using PaintShop Pro about a year later. I had always admired the amazing artwork of Ted Hammond, and then when I saw the opportunity to use his work in tags, I just had to create more.

PFD: What are psp-tubes to you?

DA: My Addiction! Ha-ha! Using tubes to create tags is a wonderful way for me to step out of everyday life and reality.

PFD: When do you usually create your wonderful tags, what's the atmosphere, the surroundings?

DA: MUSIC!!! I need music while I am creating. The music that I listen to sets the tone for what I want to create. For example, if I am wanting to do something on the dark/gothic side I will listen to Evanescence, Beseech, Lacuna Coil, etc. If I want to do something a little more edgy or with some attitude, I listen to hard rock like Apocaplytica, Metallica, Ozzy Osbourne, etc.

PFD: Do you have any special place at home or do you prefer doing it at work?

DA: I make my creations at home. I have a great computer with dual 24 inch widescreen monitors and can have my PSP open in one, and then in the other I will have the

folder open of the scrap kit or tubes folder I am working from to element the back and forth.

PFD: How do you select tubes for tags?

DA: Well it's mainly based on the type of tag I want to create at that time, the idea in my head and where I want to go with it. I am a creative team member for some incredible scrap kit makers like Wicked Princess, Creative Intentionz, Addictive Pleasures, Rieka Rafita, Designs By Ali and Scrapping Dollars. I might look at the kits they have for me to work with and pick a tube out to go with the theme of the kit as well.

PFD: How do you get the ideas for what to make out of a tube?

DA: Most of the time I will look at a tube and already have an idea of what I want to do with it in a tag... Some are cute, some gothy, some sexy, but all are amazing. The creativity of the artists that make the tubes for us to use is outstanding. When I create a tag, I want the artist to be able to look at it and say that I gave the tube some justice.

PFD: What's your craziest or most creative tube idea?

DA: Well it was one that was actually created of me and for me by Ted Hammond himself! He created a picture with half-angel half-demon, using my facial features and capturing the real essence in me, as I have that sweet loving and nurturing side, but I also have that bad naughty girl in there too! =)

PFD: What would you suggest to tube authors, what would you like to see them draw?

DA: VARIETY!!! Myself, as well as other taggers, would love to see a variety! I mean seeing hot sexy pins is great, but once in a while we want to see a tube that we can relate to a little more, whether it's hair color, body style, or anything we have a similarity to... and then MORE MEN! Finding tubes of men is rare, so to find one like the Angel that Zlata_M did is awesome, we love that!

PFD: Besides everything else, we know you as the founder of the online community "Tagger's Voice". How did it start?

DA: Yes, I am the founder of "Tagger's Voice". The reason I wanted to create it was to give a place for anyone and everyone in the tagging community a place to come together as one. Be that artists, taggers, scrap kit makers or even people that just enjoy tags but don't necessar-

ily make them, but love to collect them.

I wanted to create a common area where artists and taggers can interact and make it a common ground without the “intimidation or celebrity” factor. Many taggers were intimidated to approach an artist to talk to them or pass an idea along to them. I am honored to have many of them friends of mine where I can talk to them on a regular level and have them come to me for advice, ideas, etc., so I thought, why not make it accessible to everyone, thus creating “Tagger’s Voice”.

Since opening “Tagger’s Voice” in January, we have a very strong foundation and have many if not all the license agencies, MANY artists, and numerous taggers and kit makers that participate on a daily basis. From what I am hearing, sales are increasing all around for everyone which makes many people happy.

PFD: What’s the story behind your nick name — Dark Angel?

DA: To set the record straight, I don’t use that name for satanic purposes at all! Ha-ha, it was actually a nickname my father happened to give me when I was little. I was always his Little Angel, as being of Italian & Greek descent I tend to get rather dark skinned at times in the summer. One day while out playing I was real dark and my long black hair was “flying” behind me while running, my dad grabbed me up laughing and told me “Well now I guess you’re my Little Dark Angel”, and that’s how I got my name Dark Angel.

PFD: What are you like in everyday life, unless this is a secret, of course? What are your other interests besides what you are doing?

DA: Ha-ha! No secrets... I am a mother of 2 amazing young men, my oldest is Tyler, 16 years old and my youngest is DJ, he’s 9 and they are my life! If it wasn’t for them, I would’ve joined my husband in death by now from a broken heart after he was taken so suddenly from us back in March of 2008. My other interests... Cooking! I love to cook and bake, especially for large groups of people. I used to own an Italian Restaurant and I would peek out the window of the kitchen door each night and get butterflies until they took the first bite and I would see such a big smile spread across their faces from the enjoyment eating what I’d made.

I also manage a local rock band and teach people how to PSP through tutorials and videos that I have made.

PFD: What do you think about our magazine?

DA: I think it is a great idea. The magazine puts taggers in touch with what’s going on. It’s wonderful that they can participate and give feedback.

Before I close this, there are so many friends and fans of my tags that I would like to thank for supporting me with their kinds words, thoughts and love through the years, but I need to give special recognition to my “Family” Debbie “wolf Dreamer” Phillips, Lesia Kirby, Casper Peterson, Ted Hammond, Ed Mironiuk, Gary Rudisill, Nikki Rudisill, Omenya, Sharon Goldin and so many more that I don’t mean to forget, just we would run out of room.

Thank you for giving me this opportunity to be featured in your magazine and I look forward to more amazing work from the artists at Pics For Design.

ZLATA

Today we are interviewing one of best artists with PicsForDesign.com, who is notable for her creative ideas and variety of style. In fact, Zlata was the first one to start the tradition of Pinup illustrations with handsome guys ;)

PFD: Zlata, could you please tell us a bit about yourself? Where are you from, what does your pseudonym mean and what do you do besides drawing?

Z: I am from Ukraine, and this is where I am living, because I really love my motherland. I’m constantly drawing something anywhere I can. I still remember the first picture I drew. It was a hedgehog drawn with crayons in a sketchbook. I was four at the time, but I remember being so proud of that hedgehog!

I have relevant educational background and I work in this area, so I’d say everything in my life is perfectly balanced, and I love what I am doing. I chose my pseudonym when I worked as a freelancer, and I really got to like it over the years. When online, I really do feel like a Zlata.

PFD: Is drawing your hobby or a way to make money? What does it feel like to create a work like yours? Are you drawing for pleasure or have all your pictures pre-ordered?

Z: Right now drawing is the main thing I am doing, being my hobby, my job and something I really need. I do not have too much time to draw for myself, because all my works are orders I get, so I have to adjust to the client’s requirements. There are of course some differences in how my clients and I see things done, but we always manage to find a compromise and balance professional approach and creative touch.

PFD: Every work of yours is something new each time. You are very flexible when it comes to changing the style and creating something completely different from your previous work. What’s your secret? What guides you when you choose ideas for creating your works?

Z: I really enjoy changing and being different – every picture I draw is a kind of goal I have to reach, and our customers are the judges. It’s just that no matter what



you draw, you can't help loving it and may not see the flaws due to that. There are always plenty of ideas, actually more than I can manage to draw. I get them in different ways - sometimes they just pop into my head, and so I pick up the pencil and draw a quick sketch. Of course, not all ideas are meant to be implemented on paper.

PFD: We are always very interested in where and how pictures are created. Do you have a workplace that's specially equipped for drawing? Do you prefer silence or listen to some music that inspires you?

Z: Music sure helps a lot. I listen to all kinds of it, depending on the mood I am in, work I am about to do and sometimes even the weather behind the window. For instance, when the sun is bright, shining right through the window, you feel like joyful and light music, something like Ukrainian performers, old rock-n-roll or rockabilly. I also work well listening to Nightwish, Metallica, Ozzy Osbourne, Iron Maiden and Therion because I enjoy heavy and loud music from time to time. There is also country and of course Brother Dege... In fact, there are so many great bands and performers out there, I couldn't really name them all. My workplace is set up in the kitchen. I like having my cup of coffee without getting up.

PFD: Do you have any favorite authors whose creative work you follow? Do you try to imitate anybody, or pursue your own path?

Z: Sure, there are incredible artists out there, and I take my hat off to what they do. However, I am constantly looking for my own path, learning and feeling sorry about the limited resources used and imperfection of my own performance. I really like Dali and impressionists, so I guess I use the concept in a way in my pictures.

PFD: What do you like drawing most? Is there a specific topic?

Z: Portraits, no doubt. A face is such a mystery to me, I am ready to do them all day long, from morning till light.

PFD: Zlata, do you have a dream?

Z: I have lots of them, and they are all different. I want to go round the world on a bike, chopper that is. As for the artistic aspect, it's the large format picture of a great battle scene with knights, swords, flocks of crows and horses. I am also getting close to finishing a children's book we are working on with my colleague – there

Z: I really love being a part of it. PFD has a great team – wonderful administration and amazing artists. We are constantly communicating, sharing our plans and exchanging ideas, and it all feels like home. I would really love it to be like that all the time, to avoid gradually losing all the sincerity and understanding of our common cause.

PFD: What do you think about psp-tags – the pictures our customers create using your works?

Z: I am thrilled to see the taggers' works! I see my characters as unpolished stones: they get a new unique cut every time when used by taggers. I also really enjoy the opportunity to communicate with the customers, and think this is something artists usually need a lot. This is a great advantage when creating my works.



«Quests» is a module specially created for PicsForDesign illustration store. It allows getting conditionally free exclusive pictures from the artists working with the store.

«Quests» was conceived as a convenient marketing tool with a GAME element. The best part is that «Quests» can be enjoyed by both the customer and the artist.

The artist is the one creating their own Quest. He or she may draw an exclusive picture and come up with a task for it, uploading the info to the quest list of the store. The artist usually has two reasons to create a quest:

1) The artist would like to increase the sales of the pictures

In this case, the quest task requires purchasing a few new images of the artist.

2) The artist would like to thank their loyal customers and fans

For that, the artist just needs to specify the following conditions for quest completion: a history of several images of that author already purchased at some point.

Other types of task are possible for a particular quest.

The main distinction of PFD «Quests» is that the quest completion status confirmation and picture activation are done automatically. As soon as the customer completes the quest, the system starts checking it and activates the bonus available from the account within 30 minutes. At the same time, the customer is notified of the quest completion by e-mail.

Being a fully automated module, 'Quests' makes it possible for artists and customers to interact directly without the participation of the store administration.

Just access the menu Quests/Quest List in your account, choose the bonus picture you like, complete the quest and get the picture for free.
